Your Vote Matters

Polk County Public Schools is asking voters to consider a 1.0 millage referendum to support recruitment and retention of school-based staff and protect critical student programs. As public schools, charter schools will receive their appropriate share of the voter-approved referendum funds based on student enrollment. If approved, this funding will provide additional local resources that benefit all public-school students, including those in charter schools. The district has created a FAQ that will be updated with information as it becomes available.

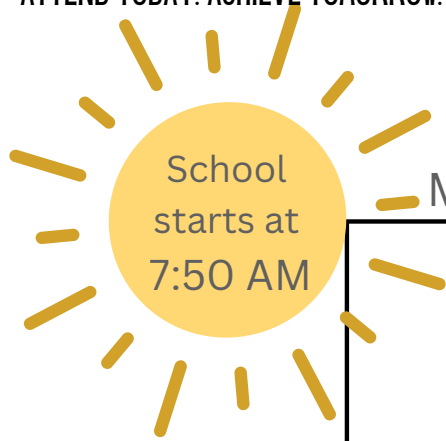


